University professorship for 'Economics, particularly experimental economic research' (W 3)

We are looking for a candidate with an outstanding track record in experimental economic research and an international network. Research achievements must be demonstrated by relevant publications in leading international journals. Success in acquiring competitive third-party funding, preferably from the DFG or comparable funding organizations abroad, as well as relevant international experience are required.

The professorship is linked to the management of the Essen Laboratory for Experimental Economic Research (elfe). The successful candidate will have the opportunity to actively shape the highly dynamic research environment for experimental and empirical health economics as a member of the CINCH health economics research center. The professorship also has an integrative role for business administration and economics at the University of Duisburg-Essen. Accordingly, cooperation with other working groups within the faculty, for example with the House of Energy, Climate and Finance (HECF) – Markets, Systems and Decisions, and with the Mercator School of Management, is desired. The faculty also cooperates very closely with the Essen-based RWI – Leibniz Institute for Economic Research and, within the University Alliance Ruhr, with neighboring universities in Bochum and Dortmund. Involvement in doctoral student training within the framework of the Ruhr Graduate School in Economics is desired.

The successful candidate will be expected to teach courses on behavioral economics and economic policy in the bachelor's and master's programs in economics. Teaching in the bachelor's program must be in German, while teaching in the master's program may be in either English or German. Involvement in courses on economics in the core area of the bachelor's program and teacher training programs is also expected. Applicants who do not have sufficient German language skills are expected to acquire them within the first three years.

The University of Duisburg-Essen attaches particular importance to the quality of teaching. Didactic ideas for teaching should be outlined that also consider the profile of the University of Duisburg-Essen.

The formal requirements are based on Section 36 of the Higher Education Act of North Rhine-Westphalia (Hochschulgesetz NRW).

The University of Duisburg-Essen aims to promote diversity among its members (<https://www.uni-due.de/diversity/>). It strives to increase the proportion of women in its academic staff and therefore strongly encourages suitably qualified women to apply. Where qualifications are equal, women will be given preference in accordance with the State Equality Act.
